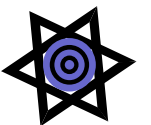

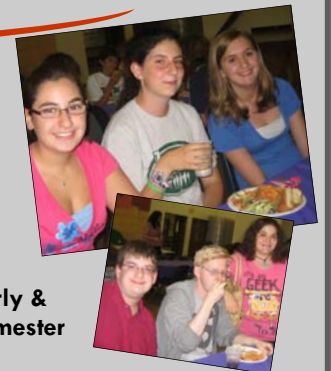


DINNER OPTION
