

Jewish Calendar Wordsearch

Rosh HaShana is the first and most important *Rosh Chodesh* of the year. *Rosh HaShana* means “Head of the Year”, the first day of the new year. *Rosh Chodesh* means “Head of the Month”, the first day of each new month. There are twelve months in the Jewish year, though in leap years there are thirteen months (*Adar* and *Adar 2*). The months are determined according to the moon. The lunar year is 354 days. The years are counted by the sun, so the solar year has 365 days. Seven times every nineteen years the difference is made up by adding a second months of *Adar* called “*Adar 2*”. The Jewish year 5767 begins at sundown September 22, 2006. It is not a leap year so there is only one *Adar*. Can you find the Jewish months in the wordsearch? Circle each month as you find it.
