

# V'ahavtah

## Game Cards

These cards contain questions about the *V'ahavtah*. Print the cards on index card weight paper. Print the questions and answer sheets back to back. Cut the cards out and use the cards that have the information your students have learned.

1. **Tic-Tac-Toe:** Divide the class into two teams. Draw a Tic-Tac-Toe grid on the blackboard. Give each player a prayer sheet. Players on each team come to the front of the room and take turns choosing a card and reading the question on the card. To keep the students engaged, ask the other team if the player is correct. If the player is correct, he/she puts an "X" or an "O" on the Tic-Tac-Toe grid. If the player makes a mistake, play passes to the other team.

2. **Board Games:** Use the cards to play generic board games found on the St. Louis CAJE website.\*
